

Black and African American families suffer worse health outcomes during pregnancy.

- Marginalized women often experience inequalities in social conditions and medical problems that lead to maternal morbidity and mortality
- Structural racism and implicit bias exist in current health care delivery models, as well as prenatal care services, and may limit a woman's ability to achieve optimum health

- Black women suffer from a disproportionately higher rate of pregnancy morbidity and mortality.
- Nationwide: up to 3-4 times more likely to die from pregnancy related causes than white women.
- In California, from 2008 to 2016, black women have exceeded Asian/pacific islander, Hispanic/Latina, and white women in pregnancy related mortality.


